

## **Luna**, or for the Greeks, 'Selene'

The moon is feminine in the Romance languages. That is why this planet is designed as a female goddess. Luna is also the keeper of spells and magic, and is the sister of Sol/Helios/Sun. Her light shines in the night, so silver is assigned to her as metal.

The German word 'launisch'/'Laune' has its root in Luna. This constantly changing light evokes moods. Because Luna circles through the zodiac once a month, a kind of lemniscate with the 12 signs of the zodiac can be seen instead of the arms. The crescent moon stands between two conical columns, each with 14 spirals, which indicate increasing and decreasing. Luna, made of bronze, is about 190cm high. (Aluminum crescent moon)
